

## May Sightings Report

Unfavorable weather conditions dampened migration through much of May as stalled storm systems delivered heavy precipitation across the region. May 2017 was the 16<sup>th</sup> wettest May on record, contributing to spring 2017 as the wettest since 1873. Precipitation totaled 5.29 inches, which is 2.42 inches above normal. Temperatures averaged 57.0 °F, exactly normal for the month. No record highs or lows were set, and only one record rainfall occurred on May 1. Early May saw a series of storm systems pass through western New York, often bringing cool temperatures, strong winds and drenching rain. Mid-month saw more favorable migration conditions as southwest winds flowed in, only to give way to 2 additional low pressure systems again delivering soaking rain.

Nearly all expected lingering species of waterfowl were reported, but numbers generally were low, and peak counts few and low. Of the species often seen into May, only Tundra Swan and Redhead were missed. No special rarities were reported. Among the other waterbirds, loon and grebe numbers were poor, and Red-necked Grebe was not reported. Double-crested Cormorant numbers continued high, especially with the large flock in Irondequoit Bay. Several rarities were reported late in the month, including: American White Pelican, Snowy Egret, and Little Blue Heron.

Black Vulture reports came only from Letchworth State Park. An adult Mississippi Kite was seen and photographed from the Braddock Bay hawk watch and sites nearby on the 18<sup>th</sup>. Only one Northern Goshawk was reported from the hawk watch and none elsewhere. Another Swainson's Hawk was seen at the hawk watch on the 14<sup>th</sup>, but with no details provided. The hawk watch count for the month was very good at 19,203 birds, with 4,914 Turkey Vultures, 12,368 Broad-winged Hawks, and 700 Bald Eagles surpassing the previous high of 664 for a year set last spring and moving the total to 1094 for the season.

Sandhill Cranes numbers passing and at scattered sites were typical for recent years, but there were no reports of pairs with young, probably due to flooding in the usual areas of sightings.

High water nearly everywhere in the region restricted shorebird habitat at waterbody shores. Most reports were of passing birds, birds stopping briefly on piers, or from transient wet areas in farm fields. Species variety included nearly all the expected spring migrants and summer residents, though numbers were generally LOW. Expected species missed were only Upland Sandpiper and Wilson's Phalarope. Two very rare species found were Black-necked Stilt, likely continuing from April in the NMWMA (Northern Montezuma Wildlife Management Area), and a Piping Plover found on May 20 in a field on North Hamlin Road by Nick Kachala and Robert Buckert.

Gulls and terns were typical for May, with the "winter" gulls lingering to typical late May dates. Rarer gulls included a Laughing Gull off the West Spit of Braddock Bay seen by Mike Gullo on the 9<sup>th</sup>, a Franklin's Gull at

Hamlin Beach found by Andy Guthrie on the 22<sup>nd</sup>, and two reports of 1<sup>st</sup> year Thayer's Gull. Lesser Black-backed Gulls were seen in good numbers, with a maximum of 6 on the 27<sup>th</sup> on the river piers at Charlotte. Caspian Terns were seen in numbers to about 200 at the usual Lake Ontario sites from Hamlin Beach to Sodus Point, with peaks all near the 10<sup>th</sup>. There was only one report of Black Tern at Braddock Bay other than the usual birds in the NMWMA, with highest numbers in the Van Dyne Spoor marshes.

Non-passerine land birds were found as expected, with no really noteworthy records. There was a single report of two Eurasian Collared-Doves from the Greenwell farm, cuckoo numbers were good, Common Nighthawk (max 107) and Eastern Whip-poor-will were reported in the usual low numbers of recent years, and woodpeckers and falcons were reported as expected.

Once again, essentially all of the expected passerine species were reported except for Kentucky Warbler, a species not reported every year here. As usual, nearly all the arrival dates were in the 1<sup>st</sup> quartile relative to the 1985 Monroe County Checklist distributions. Some species, especially flycatchers that normally arrive just after May 10 (a very chilly, wet period) seemed a bit delayed, though not for first individuals, and then often made up for by large numbers seen later in the month. Again this year there were many very quiet times birding, but also many species were noted passing in large concentrations over short time spans. There was certainly some effect on reporting with several lakeshore hotspots being inundated and inaccessible this month. Northern Shrike and Snow Bunting are winter birds that sometimes make it into early May; not this spring. Winter finches were missing other than some Pine Siskins and two reports of Evening Grosbeak. Rarer reports included: White-eyed Vireo, Worm-eating, "Lawrence's", Prothonotary, and Yellow-throated warblers; Yellow-breasted Chat; and Clay-colored Sparrow. The BBBO (Braddock Bay Bird Observatory) banding station total was about 5% above the recent 6-year average. Comparing across many years, we find that generally, variances are quite high so that apparent differences are rarely statistically significant. A selection of numbers will appear in the Noteworthy Records table for the month on the RBA website. A few interesting tidbits include: "Traill's" Flycatcher in late May at record high numbers; similarly for Blue Jay, with other observers commenting on the extended passage of Blue Jays along the lakeshore; Black-capped Chickadee sticking with alternate high and low years, this year high; also just noted that Winter Wren, too, shows alternating high/low years but opposite to the chickadees and with overall numbers obviously much lower; Ruby-crowned Kinglet numbers HIGH and over an extended period; thrushes generally LOW; Gray Catbird numbers high, as usual, and very consistent year to year; and all sparrow species at the lower ends of their typical banding totals for the month.

The table and these notes are summaries of the month's data, which included over 69,685 eBird records, about 60 geneseebirds posts other than those entered in eBird, the banding and hawk watch tallies, and other records submitted to the records committee. There were 302+ unique observers contributing to eBird this month.
