

October 2016 Sightings Report

October brought a gradual transition from the warmth of summer to unsettled weather typical of fall. It was still mild for most of the first two-thirds of the month, then cooler for the final third with 0.9" of snow accumulation on the 27th and the first dip below freezing on the 31st. Temperatures averaged 54.2 °F, 3.6° above normal, and precipitation totaled 5.26", 2.54" above normal. It was the ninth wettest October on record. This put a good dent in the local drought conditions. At least some rain fell on 20 days, and 2.53" on the 21st set a new record for the date. A low of only 64° on the 11th was a new record high low for that date.

The 210 total species reported for the month just nudges out 209 in 2009 for the highest for this month in 45 years of tracking the number. Good weather for birding and lots of people reporting are keys to this. Fall arrivals were heavily biased to the 1st quartile of their historical arrival distributions. There were no record early arrivals. Apparent departures were about half in their interquartile range and half in the 4th quartile relative to the old distributions. The 5 species record late by the old distributions all have had several later yet sightings in the intervening years.

Again, waterfowl, loon, and grebe numbers in our region were generally low. The peak counts for many species are captured in the noteworthy table. 354 Red-necked Grebes is an exceptionally high number for fall and especially this early. All really expected species were reported. There were a few more Brant than last fall, but a maximum of 400 is still historically fairly low. There again were no really big days for Common Loon. The Cackling Goose arrival was typical of recent years, with many hard to ID "intermediate" geese with them in the flocks off Hamlin Beach State Park. An immature Little Blue Heron found by Mike Gullo in the Maxwell Creek area of Beechwood State Park lingered for a few to enjoy. A *Plegadis* ibis found by Dave Tetlow on Salmon Creek was not so cooperative.

The fall raptor picture was very slow. There was a lone Black Vulture report from HANA and two Northern Goshawk reports. There were no late Broad-winged Hawks nor any arriving Rough-legged Hawks this month. Merlin and Peregrine Falcon reports were a bit above average for the month.

Nineteen shorebird species is decent variety, but numbers were generally low in our region and really not much better in nearby regions. The noteworthy table captures the few peak counts. A drop in the Lake Ontario level produced great mudflats in the lakeshore ponds and bays, but surprisingly little shorebird activity. There were no particularly rare species or unusual dates. Ruddy Turnstone and Red Knot, often reported this month, were missed.

The jaegers, gulls, and terns provided a good species list and some interesting reports, but most of these were

passing birds or short stays, so seen by a relatively few. There were only about 9 jaeger reports, 8 Parasitic, and one jaeger species. Black-legged Kittiwakes on the 9th and 30th was an early start for the species. Bonaparte's Gulls were generally few other than some good counts on mudflats. With the Bonaparte's, there were: Little Gulls at the Summerville pier and Franklin's Gulls at Northrup Creek and LaSalle Landing Park. A typical 7 Lesser Black-backed Gulls were reported, and the first Iceland Gulls showed up in Bergen and at Hamlin Beach. Caspian, Common, and Forster's terns were reported to typical departure dates.

Among the non-passerine land birds, we had the token Eurasian Collared-Doves on the 30th, both cuckoos lingering into the month, normal Short-eared Owl arrivals, reports from the Northern Saw-whet Owl banding, fewer Chimney Swifts than many years, and no reports of late Ruby-throated Hummingbird. Red-headed Woodpecker was also not reported this month.

All of the passerine species regularly expected were reported, even quite a few whose departure borders on September/October. Again, numbers were generally low, but there were some very good tallies or banding numbers reported. These are summarized in the October noteworthy table on the RBA website. This grouping started with Melissa Mance-Coniglio finding the region's 4th **Gray Kingbird** in Bergen on the 28th. The bird is still present at this writing in mid-November and has been seen by many. Four swallow species lingered well into the month, though by month's end Cave Swallow had NOT appeared. It was a pretty good year for Black-capped Chickadee movement, but the expected Red-breasted Nuthatch invasion was a bust. Kinglet numbers were good, and the thrush movement continued strong. There were good tallies for Hermit Thrush in the field and at Braddock Bay Bird Observatory near mid-month. Bohemian Waxwing was found at Hamlin Beach on the 31st. Twenty-three species of warblers were reported, including: 11 Orange-crowned, a rare Connecticut, two late Yellow Warblers, 138 Blackpoll Warblers banded, and a young female Yellow-breasted Chat banded on the 28th. Sparrow numbers were only so-so, but good numbers of Dark-eyed Juncos were reported on the 9th. Blackbird counts were weak, though people did keep track of numbers of the threatened Rusty Blackbird. Finches were generally scarce other than American Goldfinch; 340 of those banded on the 31st was a surprise and a big workload at BBBO. The winter finches amounted to only a few Pine Siskin reports and two flocks of Evening Grosbeaks found in the Hamlin Beach State Park campground on the 29th by Andy Guthrie. Interestingly, a few appeared at Doug Daniels' feeders near Canandaigua the same day.

There were about 19,110 eBird records for the month from 156 observers and another 43 notes posted to geneseebirds plus data from BBBO and other contributors.
